### Who We are:

## **MISSION**

to serve and empower orphaned children worldwide, by the love of Jesus Christ. We will do that by encouraging, enabling, and teaching them to reach their full potential, giving them knowledge, skills, and confidence to become contributing members of society and leaders of the next generation.

## **VISION**

to create small communities around the world where orphaned and abandoned children can be raised and educated in a loving family environment. We will have a positive impact, blessing the surrounding communities with our focus on the elderly and those in the most hopeless of situations.

## WHAT WE BELIEVE

Most orphanages are set up with massive rooms with a bunch of bunk beds, and 20-50 or more kids packed in a room. Those 50 kids many times only have 1-2 nannies taking care of them, and things get out of control. The kids grow up with no idea of what a family is, no idea of what chores and responsibilities are, no parental direction. So even though they get a roof over their head, a bed to sleep in and food, it doesn't really prepare them for a life on their own once they age out of the system. We want to go beyond providing just the basics for our children.

Little Lambs International believes that every child deserves and needs a healthy home. A home where they can grow up with parents who lead and guide them, teach them and love them as their own. Only this way, will they grow up to be future honorable leaders of their towns and countries.









### Project Definition & Objectives

## The Challenges:



5,500

In 2021 it is estimated that Guatemala has over 5,500 orphans in homes and 300 adoptable, but it is assumed the numbers are much high than reported.. The Government lead facilities and systems lack proper financial support and organization and the orphans therefore don't have a system they can rely on.



68%

of all children in Guatemala live below the poverty line, giving little access to quality education, oppurtunitites, and good nutrition.



**75%** 

of all children attending school in Guatemala will drop out of school after sixth grade, and only 4% will graduate from Highschool.

### The Intent:

Develop a Master Plan that enables Little Lambs International to grow to achieve the following critical objectives:

- 1. Serve & Empower orphaned children by encouraging, enabling, and teaching the children to each their full potential.
- 2. Create a small community where orphaned and abandoned children can be raised and educated in a loving family environment.
- 3. Provide Family Style Orphan Care to 200 Orphans.
- 4. Develop the site primarily for the children but also for the engagement with the local community.

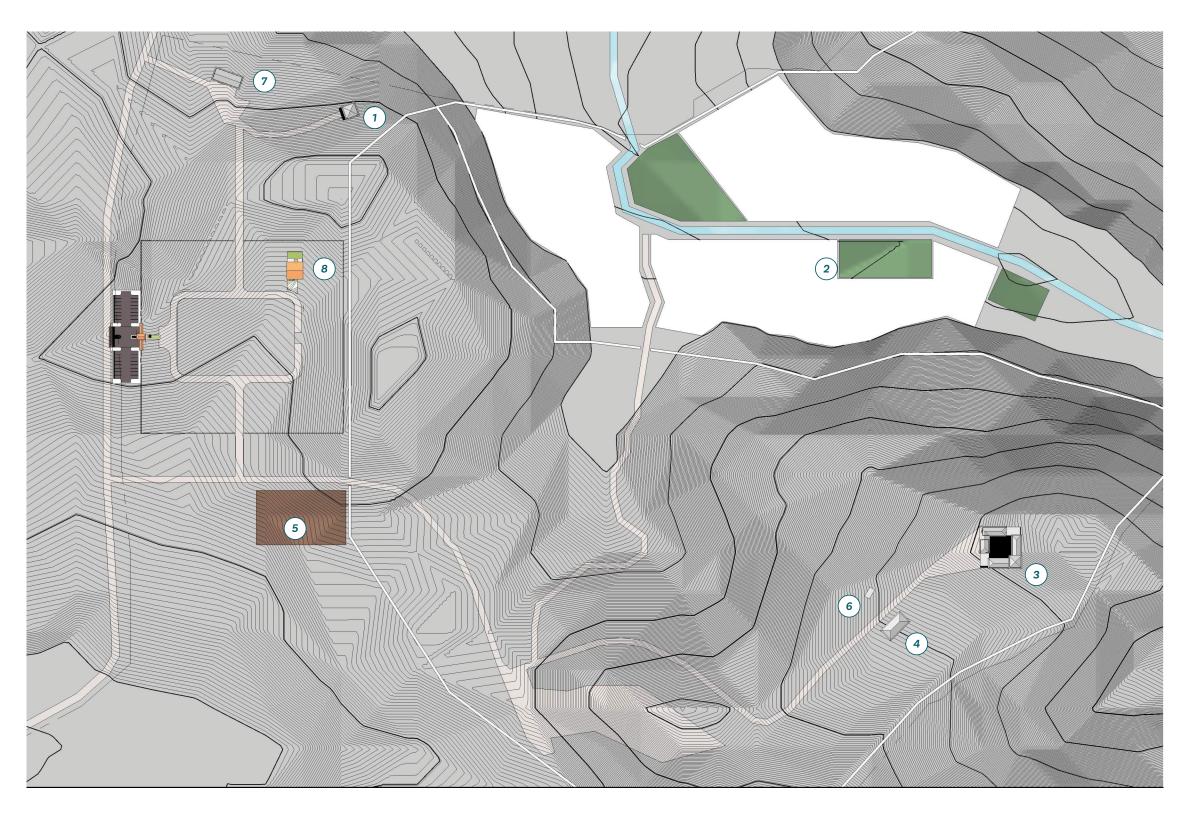
Develop the critical site components to allow Little Lambs International to function at a high level and begin to accept orphaned children into the program.

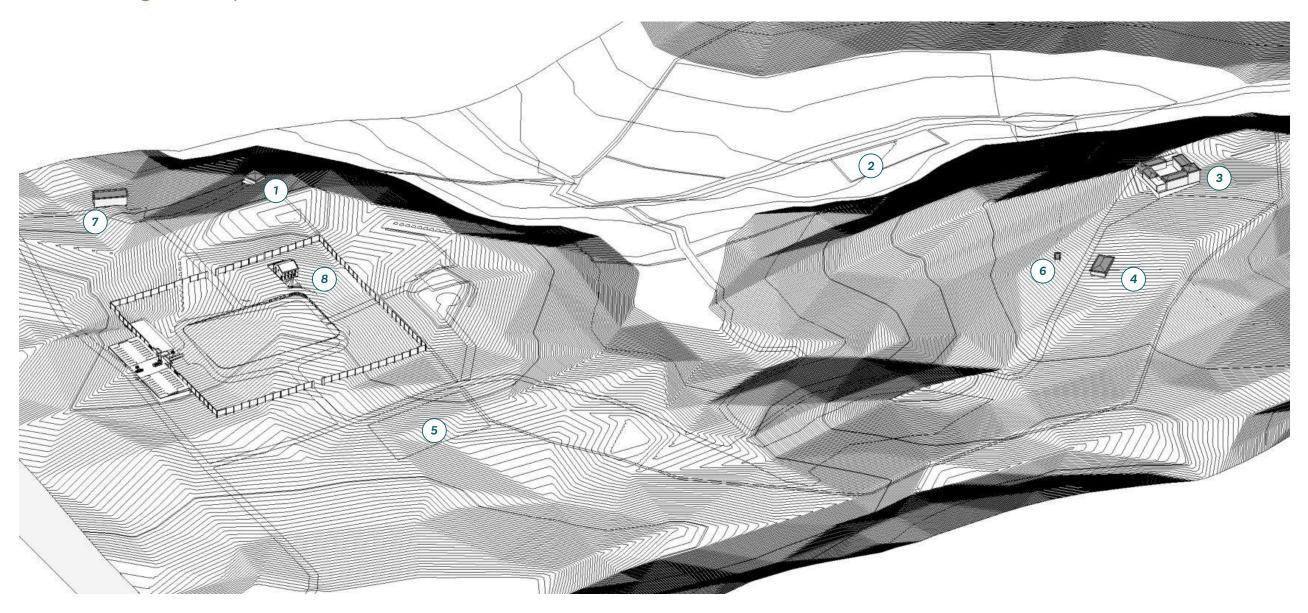
Years 1-10 starting with the ground breaking of the Guardshack and finishing at the completion of the first housing unit.

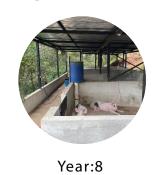

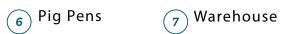

### Phase 2 Master Plan

#### Phase 2 Objective:

Enable Little Lambs International to take on additional orphans and begin moving into the lower housing area. Build additional housing for visiting staff members.

In addition to the housing, provide oppurtunitites for the children to engage in extracurricular activities such as soccer, trades, and basketball.

The church and the vocational school will also be developed as critical components of this phase.

### Phase 2 Implementation/Timeline:

Phase 2 is expected to take years 1-5 from ground breaking through final completion depending on funding. The agricultural fields and growth will be an ongoing expansion.

### Phase 3 Implementation Timeline:

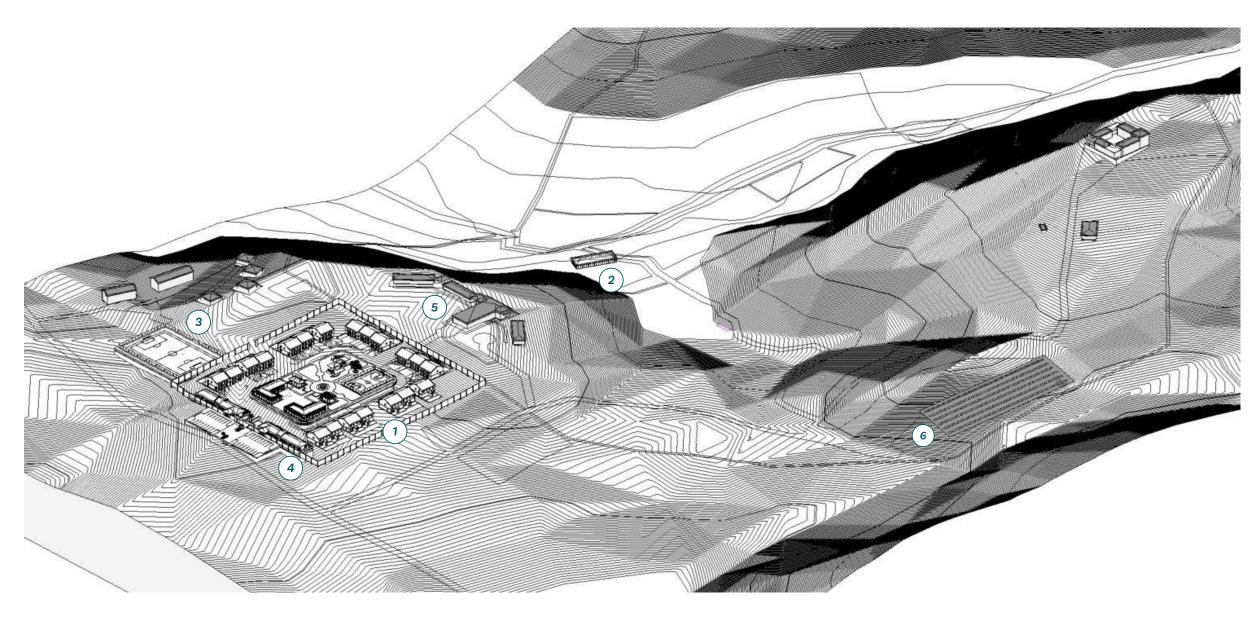
Phase 3 is expected to take years 4-6 from ground breaking through final completion. This will be the final phase as part of this master plan.

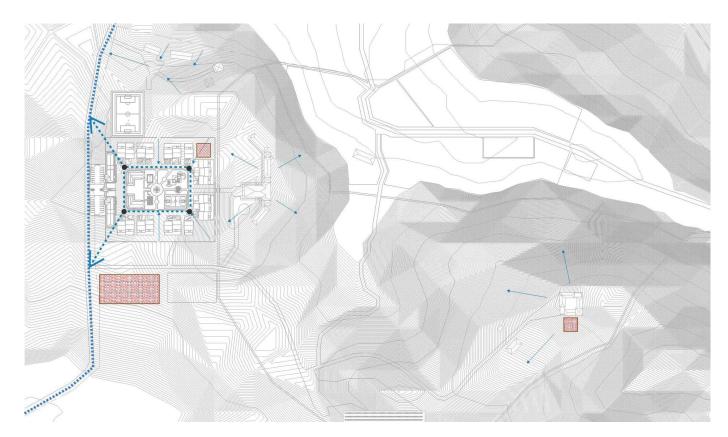




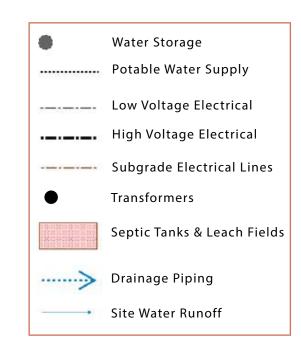
